 Funding Update (Lauren Howe) HFDK First Funding Opportunity First funding round has been approved 38 applications received and 6 were deemed ineligible. 25 organizations were recommended for funding HFDK approved an increase to funding of each application by \$5000 for evaluation and admin costs 61 organizations providing healthy food access to youth in Denver were ineligible to apply due to requirements in Ordinance 302 HFDK commission is looking at putting together a subcommittee to review the language of the ordinance and consider a recommendation to city council to potentially alter the language of the ordinance

Discussion:

- Mondi Mason provided an overview presentation of the findings of the Food Policy Council Self-Assessment
 - Some highlights of the survey include:
 - \circ $\:$ Seventeen SFPC members and ExOfficios completed the survey
 - \circ $\,$ Majority of respondents represented non-profit and food production sectors $\,$
 - \circ A third of respondents had knowledge of District 3 and another third of respondents chose not to respond
 - \circ $\,$ Over half of the respondents indicated they have experience with food insecurity
 - Respondents agree that council leadership shares power in decision making and is receptive to new ideas
 - o Respondents feel the council could improve on organization and the effectiveness of meetings
 - Responses were somewhat split regarding racial, economic, gender and ethnic diversity representation and representation of the populations that the SFPC policies target
 - o Most respondents felt participation in the council helps them feel empowered to make food related changes in their community

- o Most respondents felt the council usually fosters holistic thinking related to the food system
- o Respondents agree the SFPC works on policies that promote the SFPC mission and increase access to healthy food in the community
- o Most respondents felt the council only somewhat promotes the humane treatment of animals
- Feedback:
 - o The council has room to prioritize some of the questions in the future
 - o Determine how the council feels about Somewhat and Rarely responses
 - \circ Interest for the survey to be incorporated in the planning of the annual retreat
 - Council members would be interested in adding some questions in the future
 - There seems to be a lack of conversation around sustainability when discussing social justice inequity and this assessment could be a good venue to understand the councils awareness and priority around sustainability
 - o Interest in promoting existing sustainable models and organizations doing this work and the role policy can play in this
